

Human trafficking in SA a serious problem

GOVERNMENT and civil society need to take serious action against human trafficking in South Africa, according to a Human Sciences Research Council report released yesterday. "Human trafficking in South Africa is a serious problem and warrants intervention on all fronts," said the study released at a National Prosecuting Authority conference on the subject. Victims are mostly women, girls and boys, and they are trafficked for a variety of purposes, including prostitution, pornography, domestic servitude, forced labour, begging, criminal activity and trafficking for the removal of body parts, or muti. – Sapa
