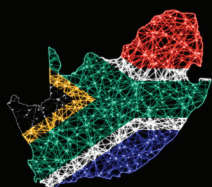

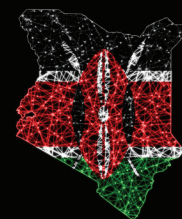

The Covid-19 pandemic has accelerated changes in education, including the use of innovative hybrid educational modalities that look beyond the classroom and the increased use of technology in pedagogical processes and curriculum delivery. The pandemic also highlighted key challenges to education systems, in the midst of these changing dynamics, including navigating the digital divide, facilitating access to data and devices, the role of the home in supporting young people's education and dealing with the range of intersecting crises that affect poor and marginalized communities.
