The issue of race, and the racism that flows from it, is a contentious one, and is an unresolved issue in South Africa. In June 2022, Brill Publishers released the book co-edited by HSRC researchers Gregory Houston and Yul Derek Davids and former HSRC researcher Modimowabarwa Kanyane titled *Paradise Lost: Race and Racism in Post-apartheid South Africa*. This co-edited volume is about the continuing salience of race and the persistence of racism in post-apartheid South Africa. The volume is premised on the notion that the work of remaking the world in truly non-racial ways may proceed on a better and more informed basis if there is a better understanding of how race and racism work in a country that has recently emerged from a racist past. The publication of the book provides an opportunity to engage with the broader South African community on this issue. It is with this in mind that a one-day Public Dialogue is being organised for the 16 March 2023 at Ditsong Museum in Pretoria.
