

A research programme centering young people and relational wellbeing in the Global South

The National Research Foundation (South Africa), the Fondation Botnar (Switzerland), and the Human Sciences Research Council (South Africa) have partnered to implement a research programme on young people and relational wellbeing (RWB) in urban and peri-urban environments in the Global South, to be implemented during 2023-2027. This programme, called u'Good!?, aims to test and further develop relational approaches to wellbeing (RWB); and generate empirical insights into key contemporary challenges to young people's wellbeing and how they are addressing these. Through the adoption of an RWB framework, u'Good!? embraces people-centred, collaborative and participatory approaches to conducting research to generate insights into how the relational aspect of multiple domains may make contributions to wellbeing. The u'Good!? programme will be launched at Science Forum South Africa (SFSA) on 8 December in track 9 entitled Science for Social Justice from 9:00-10:30.
