Scholars and community activists have engaged in several types of community-engaged research since the 1940s. While their objectives and approaches may have differed, they have always shared a passion for seeing communities not merely as subjects of study but rather as active participants in investigating their assets and challenges.

In this seminar, Prof. Timothy K. Stanton will focus on the evolving practice, principles and ethics of community-engaged research. These are especially important when scholars work with diverse and historically oppressed populations. He will offer examples of contemporary practice from his work at Stanford University in California, USA, as well as from other universities and community-based organisations.

This will also be an exciting opportunity for researchers to share their work and help improve HSRC research practices and impact.
